SEPTIC MAINTENANCE

- Minimize amount of water going into our tank.
- Follow the "yellow is mellow, brown goes down" rule.
- Avoid doing several loads of laundry in one day.
- There is no need to use septic additives.
- If available please keep basket strainers in the sinks- they help protect our system!
- Please follow the "biffy notice" posted in bathroom:



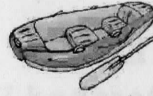
CAMPING and CAMPFIRES

- Check Local Conditions and Regulations
- Always use caution! Keep your fires small, and attended. Keep a pail of water near the fire and make sure the fire is properly extinguished when you are finished with it.
- Never burn toxic materials including garbage, plastic, rubber, oil, shingles, and treated wood



CHILDREN

- Please don't let children dam streams, disturb bottom muds or gravels, collapse shoreline banks, destroy vegetation or harass fish and wildlife.
- Take extra care on shorelines in wet weather when ground is easily trampled and soil compacted.



BOATING

- COMPLY WITH PROVINCIAL LICENSING REQUIREMENTS.
- Use PFD's at all times and have paddles and other safety equipment on hand.
- Please make sure your engine has been serviced recently and inspect fuel line, clamps and filters.
- Fuel up away from water if your tanks are detachable. Use rags and "green bin" to clean up any spills or leaks.
- Use bilge pillows or absorbent pads to soak up oil, fuel, or antifreeze spilled into bilges.
- Drive at "no-wake" speed near shore.
- Clean your boat away from shore and use non-toxic cleaners.
- Remove any plants or animals that may be clinging to the hull, trailer, motor, or hiding in the bilge.



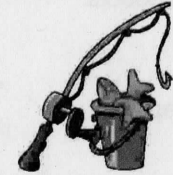
WILDLIFE/ PETS

- Animals are attracted to strong odours and smells. Please remove garbage frequently.
- Please keep your pets on leashes and dispose of their waste in the garbage.
- Please stay away from any sensitive areas (such as areas with new plant growth or wildlife nesting areas) and observe wildlife from a safe distance.
- Remember the 3 L's- **Look, Learn and Leave them alone!** Please leave plants and wildlife in their natural habitat, and give wildlife space.



FISHING

- Obtain necessary fishing licence(s).
- Please use lead free fishing sinkers and jigs, and watch your lines and lures.
- Be very careful using bait such as worms which can allow hitchhikers, like non-native seeds, to get into the water.
- Dispose of bait containers and leftover bait in the garbage.
- Dispose of fish remains by taking them to the dump.



SEASONAL

- For icy surfaces, use inexpensive sand, grit (such as limestone), sawdust or cinders.
- Please stay off thin ice – for safety, and to prevent petroleum products and battery acid from contaminating water.



ATV's/DIRTBIKES/SNOWMOBILES/PWC'S

- Please keep out of all water bodies and away from sensitive beaches and shorelines.
- Please respect others in your use of motorized recreational vehicles.
- Obey private property signs

Water Safety

- Distance Swimmers must be accompanied by a boat
Spotters are mandatory for waterskiing and wakeboarding.

OTHER

- When washing dishes, clothes, your pet or yourself, please wash at least 50 m (approx. 170ft) upland from the shore.
- Use phosphate free soaps and shampoos.
- Use safe cleaning products:
 - ✓ baking soda
 - ✓ vinegar
 - ✓ pure liquid soap
 - ✓ vegetable oil
 - ✓ washing soda
 - ✓ green scrubbie
 - ✓ stiff brush
 - ✓ steel wool
- Never move animals from one shore, beach, or tidal zone to another.
- If possible take only pictures. Fill in holes that you dig; if you pick up a rock, please put it back the way you found it so the creatures living on its underside aren't exposed to the sun and air.
- When accessing the water for swimming or boating in summer, skating or tobogganing in winter, avoid going straight down the bank and causing erosion.
